E ec ve January 1, 2000, the trustees of every college in New York State are required by law to adopt a plan providing for the inves ga on of any violent felony o ense (as defined in Sec on 70.02 of the New York State Penal Law) on the grounds of their ins tu on. The law further requires that each ins tu on enter into agreement into an agreement by January 1, 2000, providing for the prompt inves ga on of such crimes.

The Protocol below along with the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the New York City Police Department was submit ed and approved by the Board of Trustees.

A. In the case of a violent felony o ense which is commit ed on campus grounds Yeshiva University.

- 5. Safeguard the crime scene/evidence un I police respond.
- 6. E ect summary apprehension of o ender if he/she is s II present at scene and hold for responding police o cers.
- 7. Advise responding police o cers of all facts.
- 8. Work closely with all uniform /detec ve personnel to assist the vic m/witnesses and to locate the perpetrator.
- 9. If requested, provide the police personnel with an o ce with a phone to be u lized as a temporary headquarters. The o ce should be at or near the Camps Security O ce.
- 10. Prepare an Incident Report.

The Chief of Security or assistant will respond and coordinate further ac ons with police personnel and ensure that all appropriate university administrators are no fied.
