FIRE SAFETY REPORTING AND ISCLOSURE POLICY

Introduction

As required by the Higher Education Opportunity Act ("HEOA"), Yeshiva University (the "University" or "YU") has established the following reporting and disclosure procedures with respect to fire safety in oncampus student housing for the Beren Campu(sconsisting of several buildings in the Murray Hill section of Manhattan) The reporting and disclosure requirements described below apply only to fires that occur in the University's Beren on-campus student housing that owned or controlled

Relevant Fire Safety Definitions

For the purposes of the reporting and disclosure describedherein, the University defines the relevant terms as follows.

- "Fire": Any instance of open flame or othe burning in a place not intended to contain the burning or in an uncontrolled manner.
- "Cause of Fire": The factor σ factors that give rise to a fire,including intentional action, unintentional, mechanical failure, or an act of nature.
- "Fire- related inju ry": Any instance in which a person is injured as a restuble fire.

At times, the University also houses studentism the following apartment buildings (AH):

• 251 Lexington Avenue, Man hatt an (Apartment Housing – AH)

This dwelling consists of multiple apartmentunits used, in part, for student housing for the Beren Campus. This building is managed by a thirdparty management company which also leases apartments to other private terrats. The management company is responsible for providing Fire Safety Plan and Evacuation procedures to residents and ensuring that the building adheres to all New York City Building Department and Fire Department regulations. Hallways in the building have sprinklers, and each apartment has battery operated smoke/carbon monoxide detectors.

• 30 Park Avenue, Manhattan (Apartment Housing - AH)

This dwelling is owned and managed by a third partyand consists of multiple apartment units,

Portable Electrical Appliances, Smoking, and Open Flames in a Housing Facility

Rules- In general, residents are expected to maintain adequate standads of cleanliness to avoid fire hazards and must not obstuct sidewalks, entrances, passages, fire escapes, elevators, lobbies stairways, corridors, or halls with personal property. The following items are prohibited in the residence hals and will be confiscated:

- Flammable decorations
- Natural or artificial trees
- Electric heaters, air conditioners, hot plate burners, toasterstoaster ovens or any appliance that would generate a idect heat source.
- Halogen lighting equipment
- Candles, incense, outdoor gills, or any other type of open flame or open coildevice
- Explosives, fireworks, firearms, or ammunition

* This applies to all candles, including Shabbat and Hanukkah candles. Shateband Hanukkah candles may be kindled only in officially designated areas An incandescent eletric light should be utilized in student rooms for Shabd5.001 0. plate b2 Tw 1.5 -7.1 (i)-4.d

EMERGENCY EACUATION:

Housing Procedures for Evacuation in Case of a Fire

- Keep calm. Do not paic. Notify the Fire Department as soon as possible. Fire Department personnel will be on the scene of a fire within minutes of receiving an alarm.
- If your building is equipped with a fire alarm andthat alarm is sounded, you should evacuate the building in accordance with the procedures outlined in the Fire Safety Notice affixed to the back of the room/suite entry door. WHENA FIRE ALARM SOUNDS, ALWAYS EQUATE THE BUILDING.
- Because flame, heat, ad smoke rise, general

building (i.e., fire exits, stairways, alarm pull stations), as well ashe fire safety procedures for the building.

Residents should report any problems or inappropriate behavior observed to the Beren CampusSecurity Department, including damaged or tampered with fire alarms, removal of fire exits signs, missing fire extinguishers, and behavior that compromises the safety of the community.

List of the titles of each person or organization to which stu dents and employees should report that a fire occu rred.

At the onset of a fire, students and employees should immediately rept all fires to the New York City Fire Department by dialing 911 or activating the fire systems. The curity Department should be notified as well by calling 917326-4885.

Each University campus will distribute its Annual Fire Safety Rport and AnnualSecurity Report to all current students and employees bOctober 1 of each year. The repostwill be posted on the University's website on the Security Department's page at <u>http://www.yu_.edu/safety-security/</u> and can be accessed by clicking on the Reports link A notice will be distributed to all students and employee briefly describing the reports.

Annual Report to the U.S. Department of Education

As required by federal law, the University reports annually to the Education Department the fire statistics listed herein for Beren oncampus student housing as well as fire statistics for on-campus student housing for its other campuses. The University reports these statistics through the Education Department's web-based data cdection system. Statistics for the University and other schools are available at the Office of Post Secand Education's web pageat http://ope.ed.gov/campussafety/#/.

Daily Fire Log

As required by federal law, each University ampusmaintains an easily understood written Daily Fire Log. Themain office of the Beren Campus Serity Department, located at 50 East 34^h Street (1st Flog), maintains the Fie Log for the Beren Carpus.

The Daily Fire Log lists the following information for each fire that occurs in orcampus student housing: The date he fire occurred, time of occurrence, general location and nature of fire.

The Chief of Security ensues that entries are made in the Fire Log within two business days after the Security Department receives a report of a fire and updates there entries within two business days anytime it receives additional information about the fire. The entries in the Daily Fire Log are eventally used to generate the Annual Fire Safety Repto The Daily Fire Log is kept separate from the Crime Log. The most received days of each campus' Daily Fire Log are available upon request in the campusecurity Department's main office for inspection by the public on Monday through Friday during business hours. Portions of the Daily Fire Log that are older than 60 days wibe made available within two business days of a request for public inspection. The University maintaineech Daily Fire Log for three years following the publication of the las Annual Fire Safety Report to which that Daily Fire Log applies. Thus, the inversity maintains each Daily Fire Log for a period of at least seven year.

Annual Security Report

The Annual Security Report is prepared in compliance with the Jeanne CleryDisclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act.
